<u>Trails Update</u>

Attention: Due to the ongoing logging operations on Crown land, we anticipate the PL Road trail will be closed for the 2010-2011 season. Skiers who wish to ski the Kenner wilderness trail to the north and up to Bennett Cabin are advised to use caution as

they will need to cross an active logging road. Be prepared for a long day of skiing as the round trip to Bennett is approximately 4-5 hours. The Tanney Cabin loop that includes the Wolf, Kenner, Owl, and Kawartha trails is open.

Club members will notice that the trailhead to our ski trails has been relocated slightly in order to make our trails more accessible and to offer a continuous, skiable trail around our stadium area. Our Stadium Area and Sprint Loop in front of the Woodfine Chalet have been upgraded to offer better skiing, better teaching and instruction areas, and improved capacity for events and races.

The location of the Kawartha Easy trail has been relocated immediately north of the Chalet to make it less confusing with the practice loops south of the Chalet.

Paranordic Skiing at KNSC

Kawartha Nordic Ski Club is a ParaSport Ontario club - one of only two in Southern Ontario District. Watch for the following symbol identifying our para-nordic accessible trails.

Logging Update

Due to weather and other delays, logging continues at the northern end of our trail network. The logging activity is occurring on Crown land under an approved forest management plan and KNSC is not affiliated in any way with the logging activity. The active logging is around the PL road and north. In the end, our trails and club will have increase accessibility, some widened trails, and sustainable bridges and drainage. Thank you for your patience. The logging company's contract expires in March 2011 and the logging will end then if not sooner.

Wild Rock Trailer

KNSC has partnered with Wild Rock Outfitters to provide trail pass sales, ski and snowshoe rentals and lessons at KNSC for the 2011 ski season.

The Wild Rock Ski Outpost is in a trailer located at the trailhead. Wild Rock will be open from Dec 26th until the end of the ski season. Hours are 10:00am-4:00pm weekdays and 9:00-4:00 on weekends. The trailer has a wax room with ski forms and irons which is open to members. KNSC trail passes will be sold at the Wild Rock Ski Outpost during business hours (credit card, debit and cash accepted). After-hours please use the fee boxes (cash only) located beside the Wild Rock trailer.

Wild Rock and KNSC partnered to bring hydro into the trailer through an underground trench. The chalet remains 'unpowered' but we may extend it at some point in the future. Reserve rentals, sign-up for ski lessons or inquire about the services by calling the Wild Rock Ski Outpost during business hours (phone 705.933.6723) or drop in to say hello.

Trail Passes and Day Use Fees

Trail passes for day use are available for purchase in the Wild Rock trailer located at the KNSC trailhead. New this year, day users will receive a trail pass for display while skiing similar to most other ski areas. After hours passes can be purchased using the traditional honour-system drop-box located at the Trailhead.

Membership Cards - New this year

New this year, with the sale of trail passes for day users, we have decided to issue membership cards to all KNSC members 13 years of age and older. Members can pick up their 2010-11 membership card from the Wild Rock Trailer after January 1st. Simply stop in at the trailer and ask for your card from one of the friendly staff. Starting in January, members are asked to carry and display their membership card while on KNSC trails. The card is a simple, small laminated card – members are asked to provide their own lanyard or pin.
