Membership Fees and Services

The KNSC executive has some decisions to make and we would appreciate feedback from the club as a whole to help make these decisions. The overwhelming verbal feedback that we hear from skiers is positive. Skiers love the consistent conditions and the quality of the groomed trails. The reality is that the biggest operating expense at the club is by far the grooming. At present we own a Pisten Bully that was purchased with funds from a Trillium grant and it is an older machine with over 12000 hours on it. We are currently able to keep this machine running with the help of Haultain Service that is luckily located just across the road from the ski club. The second smaller machine we use is a Bombardier snow cat and it is used for grooming the narrower classic trails. The Bombardier is actually owned by one of the club members and we are able to rent it from the member for a cost that is much less than the true cost of owning it. We therefore are currently operating with 2 grooming machines that we have never had to purchase with club funds. As an executive we feel strongly that the club needs to start putting money aside in a Capital Fund to save for future expenses such as replacing the snow cat groomers. Current membership revenue (annual fees, day use fees and fund raising) supplies just enough money to allow the club to balance the books each spring; however, last year's revenue level will not sustain the club operations for the coming year, even without creating a capital reserve.

We have prepared a budget to address the required revenue and capital expenses (including HST) and it will require an average membership fee increase of 29% across all categories for the 2011 season which translates to an average fee increase of \$18.58 per member. This membership fee is still below the true cost of the service provided due to the extensive number of volunteer hours that club members donate and the generous donations that several members contribute each year. As members of the KNSC executive we feel this is the direction the club needs to take to ensure we continue providing high quality Nordic trails for years to come. We have prepared a survey to help us determine if this is the direction the club as a whole wishes to take. Please take the time right now to answer the questions on the following survey. This will give us important feedback about how you as members feel about the quality and importance of what the club has to offer in terms of trails and services.

Members will receive an email with a link to the online survey or a copy in their mailbox. The survey will close at 9pm on Sunday, August 15th.
