### Logging

Everyone will be pleased to know the logging in the area of the Tanney Cabin has been completed so there will be no interference to skiing this winter. Some preparatory work has been done this fall to get ready for tree planting next summer but this has not affected our trails. Regrowth is occurring along the edges so this will soon create a more "normal looking" landscape. The buds on the small saplings are prime winter deer feed, so we should have more deer sightings. One concern is the access to our trails by non-KNSC motorized vehicles from the forest access road, so if anyone encounters a non-KNSC vehicle please note the license and notify the executive.

Some confusion still exists regarding the logging. The logging was NOT conducted by KNSC. The MNR controls all the logging activity on crown lands and thus approved and marked the trees for logging. Our trails on crown land are winter use trails only, we did NOT have any input into these decisions. We were contacted by the logging contractor and after discussions with them permitted the use of our trails as logging roads with the understanding that once logging ceased we would re-assume control of the trails for skiing. We felt this was a good opportunity to have a portion of our trail bed improved. These roadbeds will greatly improve our ability to groom and trackset. I hope this has clarified some concerns you may have had.

On September 23 I attended a S.O.D. meeting at Highland Nordic, Duntroon, Ontario. The morning portion of the meeting dealt with our insurance coverage through S.O.D. Although there have been few claims from cross-country skiers, the insurer is becoming more strict as to the policy. Thus the need for the waiver on the application form and the necessity to be able to account for day-use skiers. In future, all family members will have to be listed on the membership form. For day-use skiers, the tear-off portion of the envelope is their day membership and thus entitles them to insurance coverage. Failure to portion it could result in non coverage. There is special coverage required for any race or event conducted by the club. Many questions were discussed.

The afternoon was devoted to racing and trail development. The latter was of most interest to me and it was good to interact with others as to how they maintained and groomed trails. Of all those present, KNSC had the longest and probably the most difficult trail system. I came away with some useful tips that I hope will work for us. In all, a very worthwhile day.

#### Signs and Maps

Soon the trail signs and maps will go up - a sure indication that snow is on the way (as I write this it is snowing!). There are always trail changes. This year's are few and short. You should have no problem finding your way.

The Kenner, ½ kilometre north of the Adam Scott (north junction) now joins a logging road. Where any trail makes a sharp turn in a clearing (a collection area during the logging operation) a post with arrows will show you the way. Yellow and red exit signs at each junction direct skiers back to the parking lot. Every map is displayed in such a say that you will be facing north when reading it.

As you know, there was little snow last year. You may not have seen some major rerouting in the southern trail section. The Haultain parking lot has been closed. Because of private property considerations, the Kawartha trail now goes south, all the way to the Adam Scott, our most southerly junction. It was also necessary to make a new Deer / Kawartha junction.

Enjoy many days and kilometres of skiing this winter.

# Memories 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Kawartha Nordic Ski Club

This year we celebrate the  $25^{th}$  Anniversary of the founding of the Kawartha Nordic Ski Club. However, in a way, it's actually our  $27^{th}$  anniversary.

The precursor of our club was The Kawartha Ski Tour, a 2 day cross country skiing even encompassing both touring and racing. The very first Kawartha Ski Tour was in 1975. It ran from the Apsley fairgrounds to Haultain on Day 1 and from Haultain to Buckhorn on Day 2.

The spirit behind this endeavour was Doug Tanney, who had skied in the Canadian Ski Marathon in Quebec, in prior years, in company with his wife, Verna, and others. On his return, Doug began to "talk up" the concept of a similar skiing event in the Kawarthas. His efforts resulted in a founders meeting at which interested individuals and associations, current club members Marjorie and Walter Shepard, Verna Tanney, Dave Kirk, John Pierce and Mary Simkins among them, met to discuss the potential. Seed money was donated by a local realtor in association with the Kawartha Tourist Association, to get us going.

With a lot of planning, dreaming and pushing by Doug, the concept grew through '73 and '74 and in the fall of 1974 a desperate push was on to compete marking of trails, clearing of trails, obtaining property owner's permissions, as well as organizing the tour itself. Doug was the Tour Director for that first tour as well as subsequent tours. Throughout the years we had a variety of Tour Directors, who all had the most demanding job. The organization of the tour was huge with the need for over 100 people in various tasks to handle the 600+ skiers who participated. In transportation alone, the Tour Minutes of the day discuss bussing 281 people on the Saturday and 422 people on the Sunday. All of this demand for organization for only 2 days of the winter. It wasn't long before the need for a sponsoring club became evident.

The invitation reads "Kawartha Nordic Ski Club In. - Founding Meeting, Tuesday, April 13, 1976 to be held at the Blue Flame Room of the Consumers Gas Building in Peterborough." and the discussion was enthusiastic and supportive. Our first Club Executive comprised:

With the help of lawyer and club member, Bill Lech, our charter and resolutions were enacted October 28<sup>th</sup>, 1976 and we were incorporated as a club. From this early beginning we've progressed from those initial rough trails, with packing and tracking done on skis, and lean-tos and campfires for rest areas, to our current status with machine groomed trails, 4 cabins, a parking lot and our own property.

So, despite this being our formal  $25^{th}$  anniversary, there are a number of us who smugly add two more years to the celebration.





### Ski Patrol Report

This year the ski patrol has 18 members, including several new to our patrol. We welcome our rookies and those who have transferred to us from other patrols. We are just finishing up our training and are looking forward to another great year of accident free skiing.

On Saturday, January 13<sup>th</sup>, Nordic members from all over the Kawartha Zone will be visiting our trails to renew on trail certification.

On Saturday, January 20, you will see all the members of the Kawartha Nordic Ski Patrol participating in a search and rescue operation. This activity is set up to allow patrollers to practice the formalized plan in case of an actual emergency. During the search and rescue, patrollers will be working in groups to comb the area for a mock accident victim. Radios and whistles will be used to communicate during the search. The Patrol Hut in the Cossar cabin will be used as a base for radio operations during the search.

If you are interested in assisting during the search, please mention it to the nearest patroller and s/he will let you know how you can help. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.
