Trillium Trail Report

The final instalment of \$7,900 of the Trillium Grant was used to pay for trail improvements to the Kenner north of the Beaver up to the Wolf, and a portion of our new "Trillium trail".

If you have skied on the Adam Scott, Deer, Beaver, Kawartha, Kenner, Owl or Wolf trail you have benefited from trail work we have been able to accomplish with our Trillium Grant. This trail work has made our trails easier to groom, and better and safer to ski. During the first year of our grant we were also very fortunate to be able to purchase trail grooming and clearing equipment which makes the job of maintaining our trails much easier.
