Again this year, the deadline for discounted membership fees is December 1st. We have also established a new rate structure where fees are calculated for individual skiers (i.e., there is no family rate). Oct. 24/ 31, Nov. 8/ 15 -- **Roller skiing workshops**. Bring your SNS ski boots, a bicycle helmet, activewear clothing and a pair of ski gloves for this 4-part workshop that introduces roller skiing as an offseason Nordic activity. \$25 for the first introductory workshop or \$75 for all four workshops. You must attend workshop #1 in order to participate in workshop 2, 3, or 4. Each workshop will last 90 minutes. Workshop #1 focuses on technique, handling, and safety. Workshops 2-4 will progressively build skier's skills on roller skis ending in a tour of the Rotary Trail. Workshops begin at 8am each day meeting in the main parking lot of Thomas A. Stewart Secondary School. Cap of 12 participants due to equipment limitations.
